

Communication in Code

Have your students practice their code cracking skills with Morse Code activity!

INSTRUCTIONS:

STEP 1: Each student will need a partner. Students will use the two code keys and worksheet.

STEP 2: Students will write a simple message or your name on the worksheet. Don't show your friend your message!

STEP 3: Spread your groups out and have partners sit across from each other in a dark room.

STEP 4: Use the morse code key to send your message using your flashlight. Remember to flash the light one second for each dot, and 3 seconds for each dash. Go slowly so your friend can interpret each letter and write it down.

STEP 5: Now it's your friend's turn to send a message to you. Have fun sending each other 'secret' messages!
